

COVID-19 VACCINE UPDATE

Protecting the health and well-being of our employees and their families has been, and will continue to be, a top priority for Bonnell during this pandemic. Many of our employees, especially our operators on the manufacturing floor and those over the age of 65, will become eligible to be vaccinated in the coming weeks. We are committed to providing our employees with accurate and up-to-date information on COVID-19 vaccines. As our Surgeon General, Jerome Adams, recently said when he was vaccinated:

“It’s not only okay to have questions about a medical treatment or vaccine – it’s normal and expected. What’s NOT okay is letting misinformation or mistrust lead you to make a poor decision for YOUR health!”

When will I be eligible to get vaccinated? Your local health department is the best resource to help you determine your eligibility. At most of our sites, our manufacturing employees, who have been unable to perform their jobs remotely, will be considered Frontline Essential Workers eligible to be vaccinated during Phase 1b. Your local HR teams will be able to provide you with additional information when your state moves into the different phases.

Where can I get the vaccine? At this time, your healthcare provider and state/local health agency are the best places to start. As more vaccines are approved by the FDA and become more readily available, vaccines may be distributed by local pharmacies. Each of our sites is currently researching opportunities for a COVID-19 Vaccination Drive, much like the Flu Shot Drive and will provide more information as soon as a plant or worksite is able to schedule such a drive.
